Message from the President...

On Wednesday 17th July 2024, Council adopted the 2024/25 Budget. Consistent with the finance model adopted in the 2023/2024 financial year, an overall rate increases of 6% has been applied, averaging increasing \$198,66 annually or \$3.82 per week, per property.

This year's budget supports the operational budget and a substantial capital works programme. In respect of our roads, the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network programme continues to drive sustainable economic growth for the region. This work is bookended by the Roads to Recovery 2024-2029 Programme that funds intermediate road works.

Importantly, the budget retains its focus on building, maintaining and preserving existing Council assets, including roads, community recreation facilities, water and sewer systems.

The Shire of Moora Council and its dedicated staff are committed to fostering diversity and developing new economic opportunities to grow our Shire and Region. By creating opportunities that attract new businesses and nurturing an environment where families can thrive, we continue to advance our community's prosperity.
